CARDIFF COUNCIL'S MOTION OF CONDOLENCE

At an Extraordinary Meeting of the Cardiff Council on 13th September 2022 the following was proposed by: Councillor Huw Thomas (Leader of the Council) Seconded by: Councillor Adrian Robson (Leader of the Opposition)

"This Council expresses its deep sadness at the death of Her Majesty the Queen and offers its sincere condolences to His Majesty the King and other members of the Royal Family. We recognise Her Majesty's enduring commitment to public service and duty, including her support for many Welsh charities and organisations, and her lifelong association with Wales and its people."

Speaking in support of the motion, Llandaff Councillor, Sean Driscoll offered these words:

"On behalf of residents I represent in Llandaff, I thank you for this opportunity to pay our respects to her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. This week, across our city the nation and the world, hearts ache at the death of our beloved Queen. 
Lord Mayor, I wholeheartedly agree with this."

LLANDAFF HOSTS THE ARRIVAL OF KING CHARLES III IN WALES

On Monday September 11th the national TV stations put Llandaff front and centre of its news-casting by presenting from our very own Cathedral Green. High Street, Heol y Pavin and Heol Fair were all cordoned off with band-new yellow traffic cones. An elite police search team was running a security-sweep throughout the area, and special camera-units were being placed on lamp-posts specially wired months before in anticipation of this momentous occasion.

The whole area was a-buzz with hi-viz jacketed Council work-people; scaffolding contractors, lamp-post painters, removers of bedraggled-bunting, pot-hole fillers, tarmac scrapers and weed-clearance teams, all rushing to bring the area to the standard required to welcome our erstwhile Prince of Wales as our new Monarch. His Majesty's first regnant act in Wales, was to be participation in a multi-faith remembrance service in our Cathedral on the morning of Friday September 16th before going to the Senedd to receive a message of condolence from the Welsh Government and to meet the First Minister and the Presiding Officer (Llyywyd) in Cardiff Castle.


